




Despite the character's popularity, the spin-off ultimately fell through due to scheduling conflicts and creative differences between Cross and the show's creators.


5. Curb Your Enthusiasm: The Larry David and Jeff Garlin Show

The spin-off never came to fruition as Donald Glover, who played Troy, left Community to pursue other projects.


8. The Big Bang Theory: The Sheldon Cooper Spin-Off

10. Schitt's Creek: The Moira Rose Spin-Off




